

## UNITED HIT FIVE WITHOUT REPLY

A couple of league defeats in recent games has seen Cornforth United slip out of the top three in the Carcraft Durham Alliance, with something of a gap beginning to appear between the local side and nearest rivals Whitehill in third spot. Last weekend, United were determined that a visit by second-from-bottom Hartlepool St. Francis would

mean a return to winning ways and a renewal of their bid for a higher League placing. United showed their visitors no mercy and claimed a much-needed victory by five goals to nil. ## A & E CLOSURE DEFINITE, DESPITE BITTER OPPOSITION



Bishop Auckland Accident and Emergency Unit is to be scaled down to an Urgent Care Unit.

Plans to close Bishop Auckland General Hospital's Accident and Emergency Unit have been approved by health bosses, despite fierce opposition from local residents. Leaders of the Save Our Hospital Campaign were not surprised at the decision

taken by NHS County Durham, although they felt that the opinions of the 16,000 people who signed a petition, along with 4,500 who signed a Facebook petition, were not taken into consideration. Despite these figures, an independent consultant,

hired by the NHS, concluded that the plans were backed two-to-one in the Bishop Auckland area. A two-year process, costing £6.6m, will now begin, which will result in the closure of the Accident and Emergency Unit. It will be replaced by an Urgent Care Unit, staffed round the clock by a mixture of doctors, nurses and GPs.

The hospital will then take on its new role as a centre for planned surgery and rehabilitation. Patients needing emergency care will have to travel to Darlington or Durham for treatment. The Hospital Trust says the changes will increase the use of Bishop Auckland Hospital while freeing space for patients in Darlington and Durham. In a message to those who joined a campaign to save the hospital on the social networking site, Facebook, creator of the group, Michael Blighe, commented, "This is the decision we all expected but hoped we would never see and is a day to be angry and annoyed at our government and the NHS Trust who made this decision."

## CHILTON MAN ADMITTED HARASSING FORMER PARTNER

A Chilton man who admitted to local Magistrates that he had carried out a period of harassment of his former partner following the break-up of their relationship must return to court later this month in order to be sentenced.

Trevor William Davies, 38, of Ford Terrace, entered his guilty plea to the charge of harassment when he appeared before the South Durham Magistrates sitting at Newton Aycliffe.

The court heard that Davies committed the offence in Darlington between October 1st and December 12th last year.

Mr. Derek Walton, appearing on behalf of the Crown Prosecution Service, told the court that Davies and his former partner, the injured party in the case, had been in a relationship from 2005 until August of 2008 when the defendant decided to return to an ex-partner and his children in Newton Aycliffe.

However, at the beginning of October last year, Davies

began bombarding the injured party with up to twenty text messages each day requesting that their relationship should resume. Mr. Walton stated that the defendant also made numerous telephone calls each day to his ex-partner which, whilst they were not threatening, they were upsetting.

On one occasion, after the injured party had acquired a new partner, Davies appeared as the couple were outside their house. He called his former partner derogatory names before approaching the man, telling him to get in the car to sort things out.

The final straw seemed to occur when the injured party and a female friend were out socialising. The defendant appeared and offered the two females a lift. His former partner declined, walked away and telephoned the police.

Following his arrest, Davies stated that he fully accepted that his behaviour had amounted to harassment.

Mrs Helen Sabbiston, appearing on behalf of Davies, a Grounds Maintenance Supervisor, told the sitting Magistrates that he accepted that his behaviour had not been rational and that his conduct was inappropriate.

Mrs. Sabbiston stated that the break-up of the relationship had hit the defendant hard, however, since his arrest in mid-December of last year, there had been no contact between Davies and his former partner.

The sitting Magistrates agreed to request the Probation Service to prepare a full Pre-Sentence Report, giving a steering of a high-level community penalty.

Davies was ordered to return to the Newton Aycliffe Court on March 26th in order to be sentenced and his conditional bail was extended until that date, the conditions being not to communicate, either directly or indirectly, with the injured party and not to enter Highfield Road in Darlington or any adjacent land.

When 36 year-old Anthony Joseph Briggs appeared before the South Durham Magistrates sitting at Newton Aycliffe last week, an adjournment of the case was granted until March 18th.

## SEDGEFIELD AND DISTRICT CAB EXPANDS SERVICE WITH THANKS TO £10M FUNDING BOOST

The Citizens Advice service is using a £10m funding boost from the Government to extend its opening hours and ensure even more people can benefit from receiving free, independent and impartial advice.

Sedgefield & District CAB is one of over 340 CABs benefitting from the funding and has extended its opening hours by providing additional advice sessions on a drop-in basis in Ferryhill Housing Office on Thursdays, from 2.00pm to 4.00pm. The bureau predicts this means they will be able to see 1770 extra clients from March 2009 to the end March 2010.

The funding was announced by the Chancellor in November's Pre-Budget Report and makes up a substantial part of the total £15m allocated for boosting debt advice across the sector. Across England and Wales the extra funding will allow the charity's bureau network to stay open for approximately 170,000 additional hours, benefiting around 600,000 extra clients

during the 14 month period to the end of March, 2010. The Citizens Advice service has seen a large increase in enquiries linked to the downturn, with sharp rises in people seeking advice on redundancy, benefits and mortgage and secured loan arrears. Last year, the charity dealt with 5.54 million issues overall and fears this will grow further as more people lose their jobs, get further into debt and risk losing their homes.

As well as seeing a 125% increase in redundancy enquiries between April and November, 2008, daily enquiries about Job Seekers' Allowance rose by 66% in the same period across the service.

Significant increases were also seen in enquiries about bankruptcy, Council Tax debts, fuel debts and rent arrears to private landlords. Local CAB Manager, Pauline Chambers, said, "This is a great vote of confidence in CAB advice and welcome recognition that bureau need additional support right now. With this money over 340

CABs will be able to stay open longer and see more people. "As people on low and moderate incomes are struggling to make ends meet at a time of increasing uncertainty about the security of their jobs and incomes, access to reliable, high quality, free, independent advice has never been more vital."

Sedgefield & District bureau will also be promoting its opening hours via posters and flyers placed in current advice locations.
